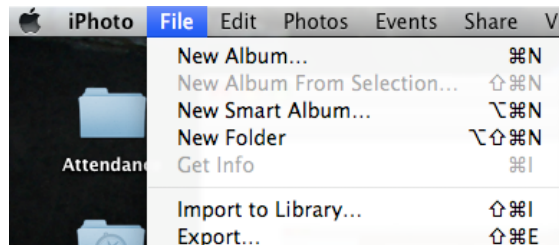


Making your Photo Page

➤ Importing Photos to iPhoto

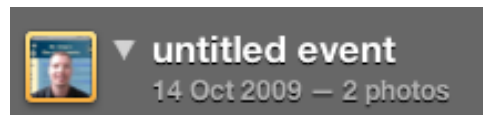
- When directly connecting a camera to your mac, iPhoto generally opens and prompts you to import your photos. If not using a camera or camera card, you may have to use iPhoto's import to Library function.
- Select the *Import to Library* option from the File menu in iPhoto.



- Then navigate to the location of your photos, select them, and click Import (your photos could be on an external drive, in another folder, or on a camera; ask for help if you need it):



- iPhoto adds the photos to an untitled event (unless you named it during an automated import)

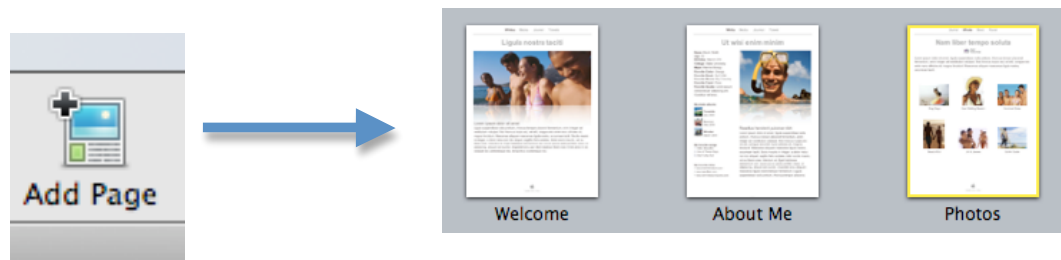


- Double-Click the words "untitled event" and rename it to "iWeb Photo Gallery"

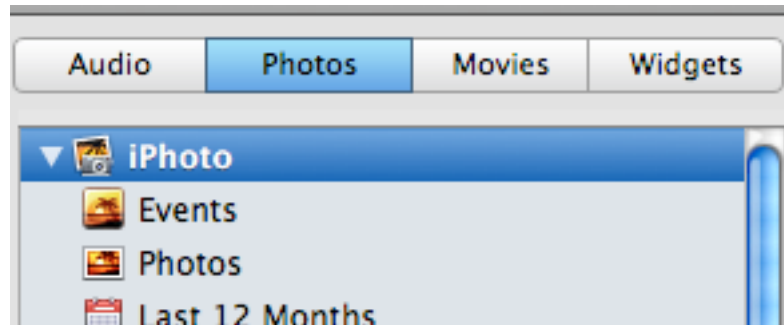


- Close iPhoto and open iWeb

- Choose the Photo Page template page for your design through the Add Page function in iWeb:



- Select Photos from the media bar to the right of the screen:



- You will see iPhoto menu options listed immediately. You can drag in your photos one at a time to the photo area of your page; or you can first select Events and drag the entire album at once.



- As you experienced with other iWeb pages, the pages come with text already included. Rewrite every bit of text to reflect your specific page:

Afternoon at the beach

Lorem ipsum dolor sit amet, ligula suspendisse nulla pretium, rhoncus tempor placerat fermentum, enim integer ad vestibulum volutpat. Nisl rhoncus turpis est, vel elit, congue wisi enim nunc ultricies sit, magna tincidunt.

- Rewrite the title and description to describe your collection of photos (explain in general terms what they are, and why you included them)
 - Rewrite the caption under each photo to describe the photo.
- The next page to add will be a Podcast page titled “Learning at Elsa High”. Record one video of work in any class to prepare for adding this page.
